

Biologists to study rare Bird on Grand Bahama

Freeport, Grand Bahama, February 18 - International and local agencies are teaming up to learn more about the winter habitat of the rare Kirtland's Warbler and other birds of conservation concern on Grand Bahama and New Providence. The research team includes representatives from the Bahamas National Trust (BNT), Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, The Nature Conservancy, The Wilderness Society, U.S. Forest Service, North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and the Kirtland's Warbler Recovery Team. The team visited New Providence on 13-18 February and Grand Bahama on 19-27 February.

The Kirtland's Warbler is an endangered species due to loss of nesting habitat and nest parasitism by the brown-headed cowbird. The U.S. participants have studied the warbler extensively on its summer breeding grounds in Michigan. Research has led to the formation of a Kirtland's Warbler Recovery Programme and intensive management of nesting sites in the jack pine forests of five Michigan counties. Warbler populations have grown from an all-time low of 201 males in 1971 to over 600 males in 1997. The population is censused each summer by counting males which sing in their territories.
