Dear Mr. Mayfield:

Last November Messrs. Dockham, Ryel and I spent a day in the field checking several possible Kirtland Warbler management sites in Kalkaska and Crawford Counties. In addition, we later checked some possible sites in Roscommon, Ogemaw and Oscoda Counties.

Mr. Dockham, as you suspected, has gone to Florida for the winter. I'm not sure what he has written you concerning our checks.

I'm not sure what your committee has in mind for the size and number of areas. I assume you want each to be of sufficient size so as to have around 80 acres in suitable habitat at all times.

Roscommon - Ogemaw Area:

I believe Mr. Dockham may have sent you our map of this area. There is a colony of birds, approximately 15 pairs last year, in sections 1, 11 and 12, T23N, R1W, Roscommon County. A portion of this immediate area may come into Warbler habitat in several years, however, the largest piece of likely habitat for the future is sections 27, 28 and 34, T24N, R1E, Ogemaw County.

There has been an unmated male in section 27 (not 34 as was previously indicated, I believe) for the past two summers. Most of these three sections were burned during the large Horseshoe Lake fire of
