1. I have inclosed a copy of DNE's Hirtland's Warbler Closure Order effective 1 May-15 August 1976.
2. Colonel Fowis is not alarmed by it. He recalls Mr. Eyselich and Mr. Perez at the 2 March meeting being confident the 1976 census would show no birds in Sections 15, 19, W 1/2 of 17 and the NE 1/4 and S 1/2 of 16, T27N-R2W. He says that DNE will, by 10 June 1978, tell us what sections we can have back to train in.
3. I will continue to keep you informed on this situation.
